## TIPS and Tricks for Your First FEI

- Set up stall before you unload your horse
- You must have your number on your horse at all times on show grounds. A good trick to meet this requirement and not ruin your bridle tags is to put light coloured duct tap on the halter and write the horses number with a permanent market.
- Arrive to in barns with horse well groomed and turned out. Make sure you are aware of the hours that in barns take place
- To help make legs and tails white you can cover them with a paste made of baking soda, ivory soap and a touch of water. Let sit for 5-10 min. Then spray with vinegar and scrub with shampoo and rinse.
- There is a new FEI rule banning the shaving of sensory hairs on the muzzle, eyes and outer ears. Non compliance = disqualification
- When in doubt, pack extra feed. Better to have too much than not enough
- Helmets are now mandatory whenever mounted
- If you aren't sure what studs to use, ask other riders! Other riders are very nice and usually very happy to help!!
- Make sure you bring buckets, sponges, sweat scraper, wrench, magnetic plate and duct tape to the cool out area. This equipment should be set up and ready to go before horse and rider head out on course
- Adequan can be given on the show grounds in the vet stall
- Show jumping is in reverse order, make sure you know when you go so you give yourself enough time to warm up. There are NO stadium jumping times!!!
- If you are unsure....Ask someone!!!
