# 2023 in review: EC to OEA to members



## Rule Change for 2023

**EQUINE CANADA**  
**ÉQUESTRE**

**EXERCISING AND WARMING UP**  
ARTICLE D107.2.1 and 2.4


**Restrictions on Schooling Horses.**

**The period of restriction shall begin at 4:00 pm the day prior to the start of the Horse's competition, unless otherwise defined by the competition organizer. Any alternate periods of restriction shall be listed in the schedule page/prize list.**

**Under penalty of elimination, prior to the actual competition it is forbidden to ride in or around the dressage or jumping arenas unless specifically authorized by the Ground Jury. The exception to this rule is participation in an approved schooling activity hosted by the competition organizer.**

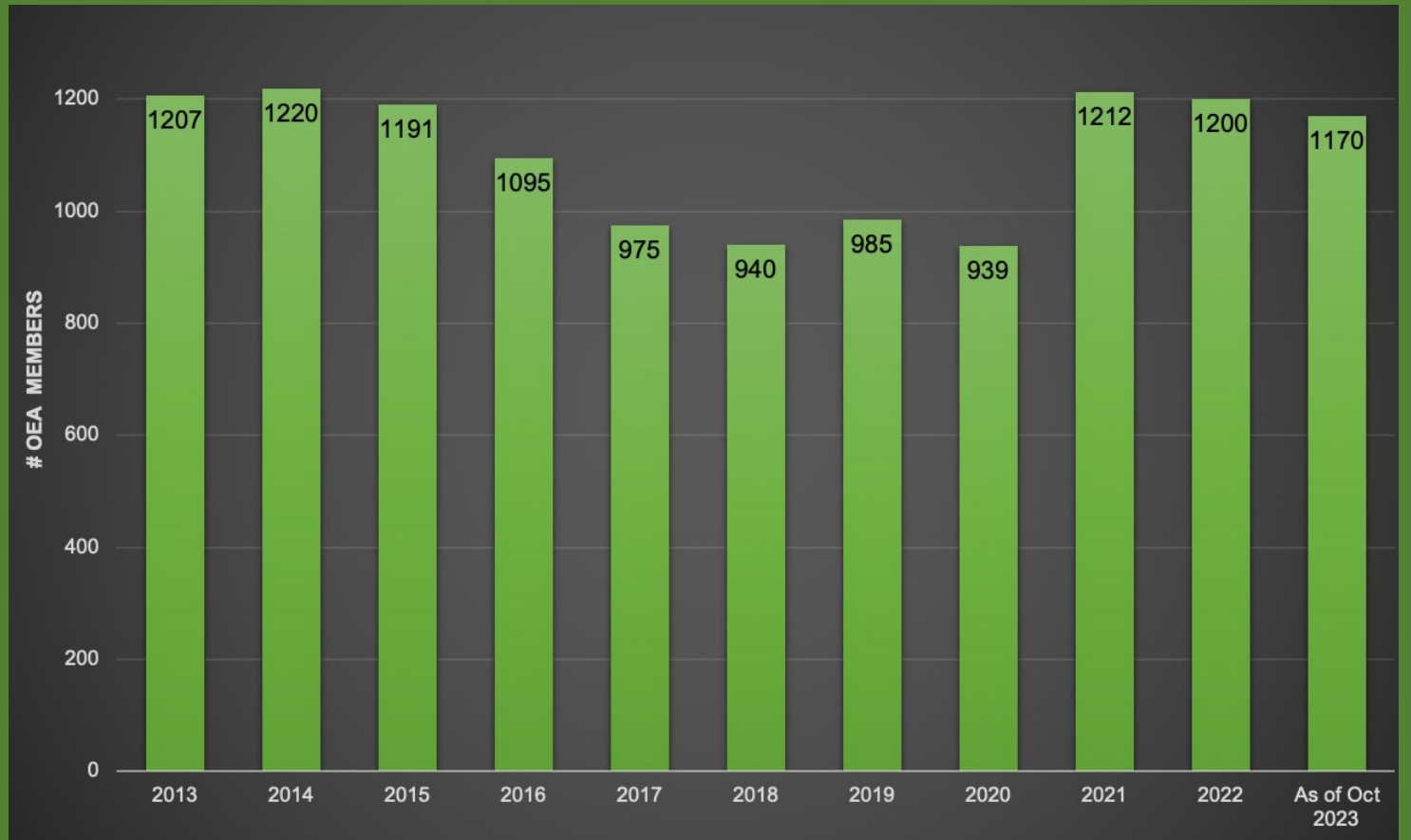
# 10 Years of OEA Membership:

In 2020, to help our members during COVID-19, we offered a “bonus year” which helped carry our members into 2021 and 2022.

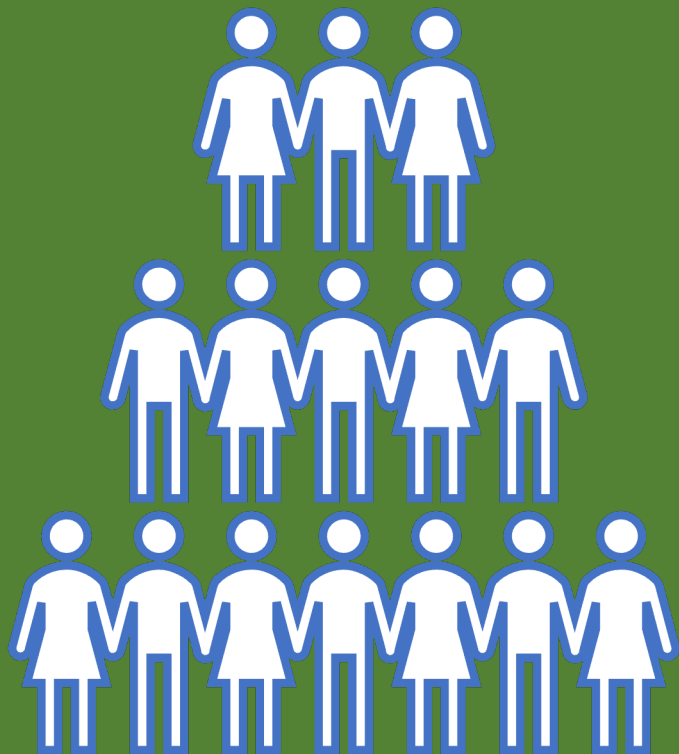
2023 saw membership actually stabilize, without the “bonus year.”

# OEA U25 2023 Program Highlights:

The **U25 Program** goal is to provide a fun, safe training and competition experience where sportsmanship and friendship are developed, leadership opportunities realized, volunteerism is promoted and an avenue to the uppermost level of our sport is provided.

Participants in the program pay a \$100 flat fee to join. This gives the riders access to clinics, a dedicated leaderboard, sponsored prizes, online educational sessions, and discounted U25 branded clothing among other items.

This year we had **44** horse and rider combinations participating in the program. Riders came from across the province, from Eastern Ontario, to Windsor, to Northern Ontario.





# U25 Travel and Training Grants:

## Continuing the path to High Performance

Once again, we were pleased to offer **Travel and Training Grants** to riders across the province. A critical element of all grant applications is to volunteer to help grow the sport of eventing in Ontario.

For 2023, the OEA U25 Committee offered up to \$5,000 in training and travel grants to U25 members. These grants were to assist with travel expenses to competitions, to attend U25 Clinics and Events, or to be able to travel to train with a coach in order to improve their skills and horsemanship. Each applicant could receive up to \$1000, based on individual need.

A total of 17 riders from across the province applied for grants this year. Twelve grants were awarded, with \$5,000 in grant monies being disbursed.

Congratulations to all our grant recipients! We look forward to watching your progress continue over the next year!





# U25 Onwards:

## Rebecca Howard Clinic at Will O'Wind

The Rebecca Howard clinic at Will O'Wind July 27<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup> was a huge success! The week started out with two days of training with our Canadian High Performance riders, followed by the two-day OEA clinic.

Thursday sessions were focuses on technical skills in the show jumping ring and Friday was out in the cross-country field. We had 30 participants, 16 of whom were U25 riders. Rebecca is an excellent coach and clinician and all of the riders showed improvement over the two days.

We also had educational session over lunch, including "Heart Rate Monitoring for Horses: What to Know and Why it Matters!" with Dr. Perse McCrae PhD, "Nutrition for Competition Horses: The Essentials" with Elise Lafleur, MSc., "Rider Fitness and Why it Matters" with Nardine Oakes of The Strong Rider", and finally "The Pathway to High Performance" with Rebecca Howard, our Team Canada Chef d' Equipe.

Auditing was FREE to all our U25 riders, including the two days of High Performance training sessions - a wonderful educational opportunity. A huge thank you to Will O Wind for donating the use of their beautiful facility and to Mad Barn for sponsoring lunch and snacks along with the OEA.
